## Dangers Facing the Believer Highlighted in 2 Thessalonians

### 1. Persecution and Suffering (1:4-5):

- **Danger:** Being discouraged or shaken by ongoing persecutions and afflictions.
- **Application:** Recognize that suffering is evidence of God's righteous judgment and endure with faith and perseverance.

### 2. Deception about the Day of the Lord (2:1-2):

- **Danger:** Being unsettled or alarmed by false teachings and misinformation regarding the return of Christ.
- **Application:** Hold firmly to the truth of Paul's teachings and not be swayed by false messages.

### 3. Apostasy and the Man of Lawlessness (2:3-4):

- **Danger:** Falling away from the faith or being deceived by the man of lawlessness.

- **Application:** Remain steadfast in faith, aware of the events that must precede the Day of the Lord.

#### 4. The Mystery of Lawlessness (2:7):

### Well-known Passages from 2 Thessalonians

[2 Thessalonians 1:5-8 ESV] This is evidence of the righteous judgment of God, that you may be considered worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are also suffering— since indeed God considers it just to repay with affliction those who afflict you, and to grant relief to you who are afflicted as well as to us, when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels in flaming fire, inflicting vengeance on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus.

[2 Thessalonians 2:1-4 ESV] Now concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered together to him, we ask you, brothers, not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by a spirit or a spoken word, or a letter seeming to be from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord has come. Let no one deceive you in any way. For that day will not come, unless the rebellion comes first, and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of destruction, who opposes and exalts himself against every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, proclaiming himself to be God.

[2 Thessalonians 2:7-10 ESV] For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work. Only he who now restrains it will do so until he is out of the way. And then the lawless one will be revealed, whom the Lord Jesus will kill with the breath of his mouth and bring to nothing by the appearance of his

coming. The coming of the lawless one is by the activity of Satan with all power and false signs and wonders, and with all wicked deception for those who are perishing, because they refused to love the truth and so be saved.

[2 Thessalonians 2:14-17 ESV] To this he called you through our gospel, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. So then, brothers, stand firm and hold to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by our spoken word or by our letter. Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God our Father, who loved us and gave us eternal comfort and good hope through grace, comfort your hearts and establish them in every good work and word.

[2 Thessalonians 3:3-5 ESV] But the Lord is faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one. And we have confidence in the Lord about you, that you are doing and will do the things that we command. May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ.
